The faint and probably the only memory that I have of myself as a child playing along with kids in the barren fields of Ladakh, is of acting as a news--reporter at a battle scene. The constant rumbling of Indian army trucks and the overwhelming presence of camoutlage in the vicinity influenced the games that we played. Although the barren fields of Ladakh and the childish plays are far away, but my fascination with active journalism somehow remains still now, the personal battle not yet won. Our tamily of four, my younger sister of eleven making up the fourth member is supported by the modest salary of my mother. As a montessary teacher she has been serving our Tibetan community at an SOS school for the past twenty years. My father, a retired army personel of twenty-eight years now shows heener interest in religious pursuits than in the family livelihood. Somehow, we will have to make further adjusments to meet the financial requirements of my University education unattented to by your esteemed scholarship programme, which I will try my best to cut down as much as possible. The major in English degree that I am pursuing right now is what I see as a stepping stone towards reaching my goal of becoming a media personal. After my graduation, I plan to apply for a Master's degree in

Mass Communication to realise my childhood dream and to contribute constructively towards schowaging the plight of my people. I want to harness the

power of media to present a true face of the sufferings of my country under the Chinese and to inspire my people towards attaining the greater goal of freedom. I want and hope to do something for my country and my fellow Tibetan brothers & sisters.
